Minutes of the Screening Committee meeting held on 4th of May, 2017 & 11th July, 2017 on the issue of regularization of left out employees of NYKS

- The 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the Screening Committee Notified vides Office Order Ref No. NYKS/PERS:regularization/514/2008 dated 20/04/2017 was conducted on 11<sup>th</sup> of July, 2017 under the chairmanship of ED, NYKS to review the recommendations & findings of the earlier screening committees held on 13/05/2009, 25/07/2012 and11/10/2012 to verify the service records of the left out employees of of NYKS for regularization of their services.
  - Following Members were present in the meeting;
  - Sh. S. K. Thakur, Director-FB&A, NYKS
  - · Nand Kumar Singh, Deputy Director-Pers.
  - . Sh. A. P. Singh, Asist. Director (Legal), NYKS
  - . Sh. Grish Kumar Jha, MTS, NYKS
- Sh. Atish Ganguly, Assistant Director-Pers. was also present in the meeting.
- Earlier 3 screening committee meetings were held on 13/05/2009, 25/07/2012 and11/10/2012 to scrutinized service record of employees of NYKS left out for their regularization.
- 4 136 employees were found fit for regularization. However, order for their regularization could not be issued earlier. Committee referred Service Regulations and RR-1998 for considering cases for regularization. This screening committee also found them fit.
  - (i) This committee recommends regularization of these 136 employees those found fit by earlier screening committees.
  - (ii) 47 employees continued from Pre-Sangathan period and were absorbed in Saganthan at its inception. Their services could not be regularized because of various reasons. Since they were absorbed by the Court Orders, this committee recommends regularization of these employees.
  - (iii) 21 employees (Group Ds) belong to SC/ST categories were found overaged by the earlier screening committees. It was found that the earlier committee had not considered age relaxation which is permissible for these employees in the Service Regulations/RRs. Accordingly, if the due age relaxation is considered to them, this committee recommends for the regularization of these employees from the date of their joining.
  - (iv) Pending cases owing to non-vigilance clearance at that time: Screening Committee in its meeting held during 18 December, 2001 to 18 January, 2002 had recommended for regularization of certain employees. Before issuing order of regularization,

vigilance clearance was sought. Cases of 22 DYCs and 6 ACTs were found under departmental proceedings and therefore, their regularization was kept pending.

- (v) The case of Sh. A. P. Singh, was found fit as Legal Officer since 05/04/1995 by the screening committee during 2001-02. However, as per record, his regularization order could not be issued at that time inadvertently. This committee recommend for issuance of his regularization order now.
