

Vision of NEP - 2020:

The National Education Policy aims at building a global best education system rooted in Indian ethos, and aligned with the principles enunciated above, thereby transforming India into a global knowledge superpower.

Role of NYKS:

To accomplish the above Vision, the document of NEP-2020 has emphasized following specific roles for NYKS and its volunteers.

- Disseminating of salient features of National Education Policy, 2020, to Gram Panchayat, students, parents and community.
- Sharing of the video on the main address of Hon'ble Prime Minister during the launch of National Education Policy 2020 through WhatsApp and Webinars.
- Explaining the role of teachers, parents, community and members of PRIs.

Initial Webinar for Orientation:

A Webinar was organized on 16th September 2020 by Ministry of HRD specifically for the NYKS and NSS Volunteers so that they could facilitate proper and effective dissemination of salient features of NEP-2020. The Webinar were graced by Hon'ble Sh. Rajnath Singh, Defence Minister and Sh. Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank, Hon'ble Minister of HRD and Sh. Kiren Rijiju, Minister of State(I/C), Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports.

Smt. Usha Sharma, Secretary, Deptt. of Youth Affairs appealed to the youth volunteers of both NYKS and NSS to gear up and take up necessary steps for accomplishing the tasks which are expected from them in respect of effective dissemination of NEP 2020. She also shared strategy and road map to take up the designated activities with mission mode approach.

Inclusion in NEP 2020

- Socio-Economically Disadvantaged Groups (SEDGs) can be broadly categorized based on:
 - gender identities (particularly female and transgender individuals),
 - socio-cultural identities (such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, OBCs, and minorities), geographical
 - Geographical identities (such as students from villages, small towns, and aspirational districts),
 - disabilities (including learning disabilities), and
 - socio-economic conditions (such as migrant communities, low income households, children in vulnerable situations, victims of or children of victims of trafficking, orphans including child beggars in urban areas, and the urban poor).
- While overall enrolments in schools decline steadily from Grade 1 to Grade 12, this decline in enrolments is significantly high among SEDGs, with even greater declines for female students

Highlights of NEP 2020

SINGLE REGULATOR FOR ALL HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS EXCEPT FOR LEGAL AND MEDICAL COLLEGES

- Fee fixation under broad regulatory framework
- MPhil programmes to be discontinued
- Common entrance exam for admissions to universities and colleges
- Common norms for private and public higher education institutions
- Affiliation of colleges to be phased out in **15 years**
- Stage-wise mechanism for granting graded autonomy to colleges
- Multidisciplinary Education and Research Universities (MERUs) to be set up at par with IITs, IIMs
- **10+2** structure to be replaced with **5+3+3+4** curricular structure
- Vocational education to be integrated from **Class 6**
- Sanskrit to be offered at all levels of school, higher education
- HRD Ministry to be renamed Education Ministry

- 📎 Duration of Under-Graduate (UG) programmes in colleges will be either 3 or 4 years
- 📎 Post-Graduate (PG) programmes offered by universities can be for 1 or 2 years
- 📎 Option of an Integrated 5 year Bachelor's/Master's Programme
- 📎 M Phil programmes will be discontinued under the new education system
- 📎 Facility of Credit Transfer for students who leave a course mid-way; Academic Bank of Credits will be maintained for this purpose

NEW EDUCATION STRUCTURE

NEP has changed the 10+2 system into a 5+3+3+4 curricular structure corresponding to ages 3-8, 8-11, 11-14, and 14-18 years. It will comprise 12 years of school and three of pre-school

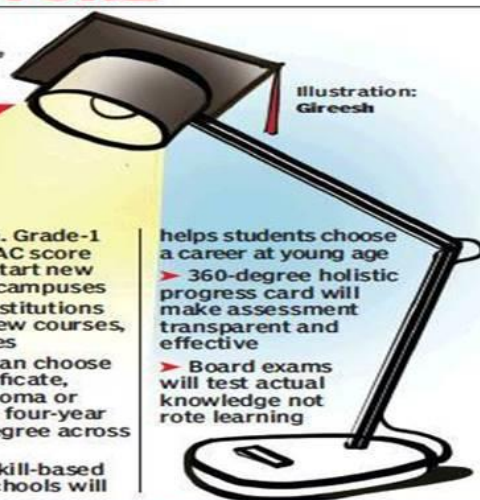
- > Fulfills long-pending demand for educational reforms
- > Introduces liberal & flexible education, particularly higher education
- > Plan to raise public expenditure by almost 6% of GDP will play a crucial role in Aatma Nirbhar Bharat
- > Promotion of pvt sector education

will boost FDI

- > NEP plans to set up of teachers' training academy, use tech for teaching, give autonomy for institutions, infrastructure, and research and seek internationalization of education
- > Through credit transfer system a student will get the recognition for the years he spent on a course, even if he doesn't complete it
- > Graded autonomy for colleges with NAAC

- accreditation. Grade-1 colleges (NAAC score of 3.51) can start new courses and campuses
- > Grade-II institutions can launch new courses, award degrees
- > Students can choose a 1-year certificate, two-year diploma or three-year or four-year bachelor's degree across disciplines
- > Focus on skill-based learning in schools will

- helps students choose a career at young age
- > 360-degree holistic progress card will make assessment transparent and effective
- > Board exams will test actual knowledge not rote learning



KEY DOWNSIDES

- > NEP promotes privatization and corporatisation of education which could sound the death knell for public education
- > Privatisation of education will affect opportunities of

- students in dalit, backward and marginalized communities
- > The plan to completely shift from affiliation to autonomous system in 15 years will affect institution in rural and backward regions
- > Issues related to

- recognition of courses in higher education will rise
- > Policies will reduce academic, administrative autonomy of universities
- > No universities in Kerala can match the criteria mentioned under the policy's research university level

- > Modular nature of courses will disrupt continuity and incentivise dropping out
- > As education comes in concurrent list, no discussions have been conducted with states or in parliament
- > Integration of academics and co/extra curriculum will be dangerous

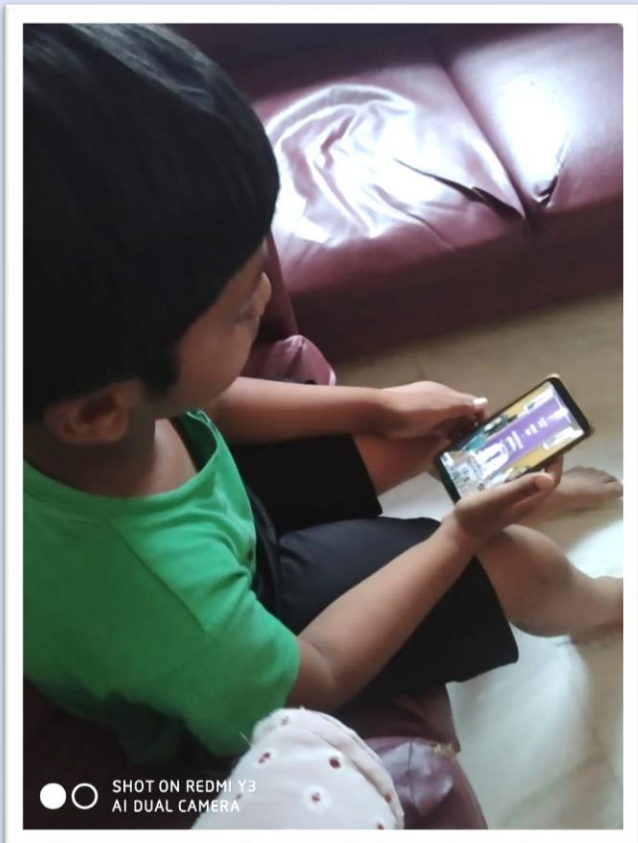

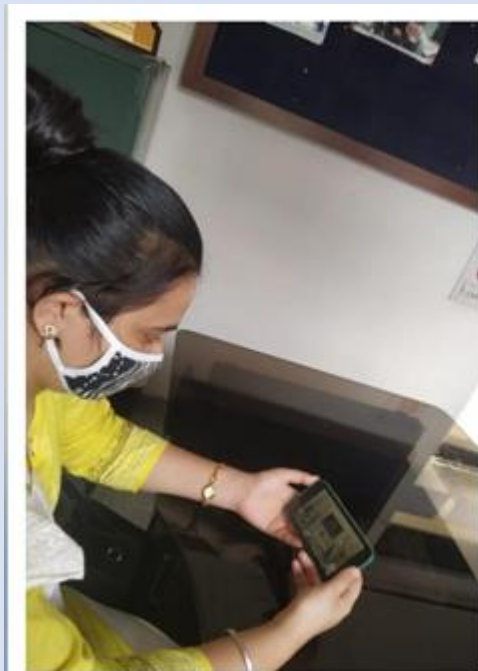

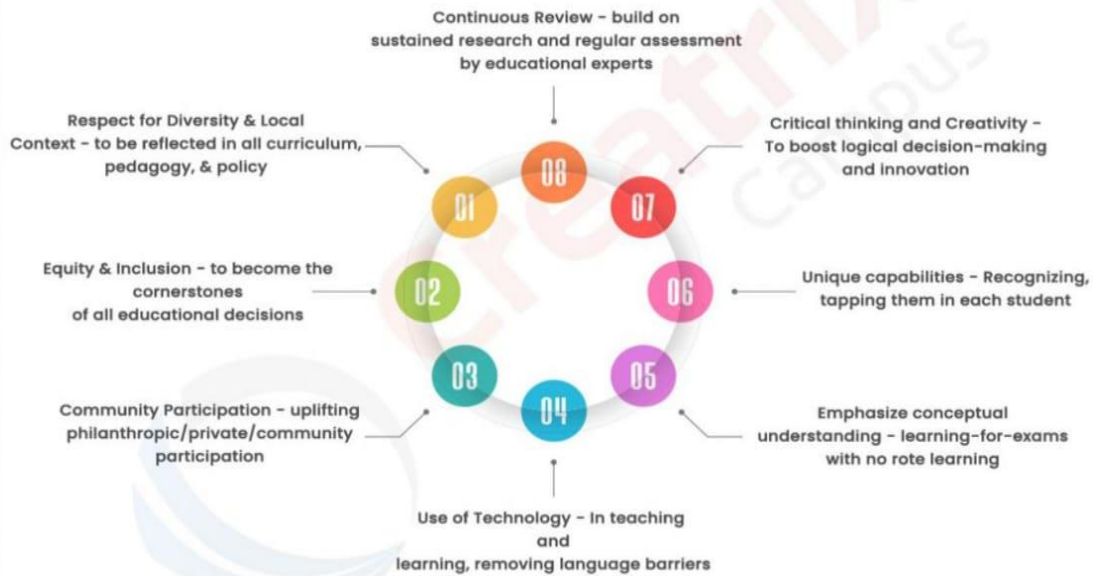

- Existing 10+2 system to be replaced with a 5+3+3+4 system
- Foundational Stage (5):** Play School to Class 2 – multi-level play activity-based learning
- Preparatory Stage (3):** Class 3 to 5 - discovery & activity-based classroom learning
- Middle Stage (3):** Class 6 to 8 – experiential and critical learning
- Secondary Stage (4):** Class 9 to 12 - multidisciplinary study with greater critical thinking, and flexibility
- Medium of instruction till Grade 5 would be mother tongue or local language, Class 6 onwards vocational courses available, and Class 8 onwards subject choices available.

Current system

- RTE covers Class 1 to Class 8

- Rote learning, formal teaching in preschools
- WCD Ministry oversees anganwadi system

Draft policy recommendations

- RTE from preschool (age 3 onwards) till Class 12
- Integrated primary school framework from age 3 to 8
- Anganwadis, preschools to be linked to local primary schools
- Focus on play and discovery-based learning
- MHRD to oversee educational aspects

- 10+2 board structure is dropped.
- New school structure will be 5+3+3+4.
- Upto 5 pre school
6 to 8 Mid School

- All University government, private, Open, Deemed, Vocational etc. will have same grading and other rules.
- New Teacher Training board will be setup for all kinds of teachers in country, no state can change.
- Same level of Accreditation to any college based on its rating college will get autonomous rights and funds
- New Basic learning program will be created by government for parents to teach children upto 3 years in home and for pre school 3 to 6.

- Multiple entry and exit from any course.
- Credit system for graduation for each year student will get some credits which he can utilize if he takes break in course and come back again to complete course.
- School exams after 9th will be semester wise twice a year.
- The syllabus will be reduced to core knowledge of any subject.
- More focus on student practical and application knowledge.
- For any graduation course if student complete only one year he will get a basic certificate, if he complete two years then he will get Diploma certificate and if he complete full course then he will get degree certificate. And after 4 years of graduation student will get Research degree on the basis of assignments. So no year of any student will be wasted if he break the course in between.
- All the graduation course feed of all Universities will be govern by single authority with capping on each course.
- Students can learn Computer coding from 6th std onwards.
- If students doesn't get admission in cut-off basis than he can appear for CAT (Common Apptitude Test) and get admission on the basis of CAT marks.

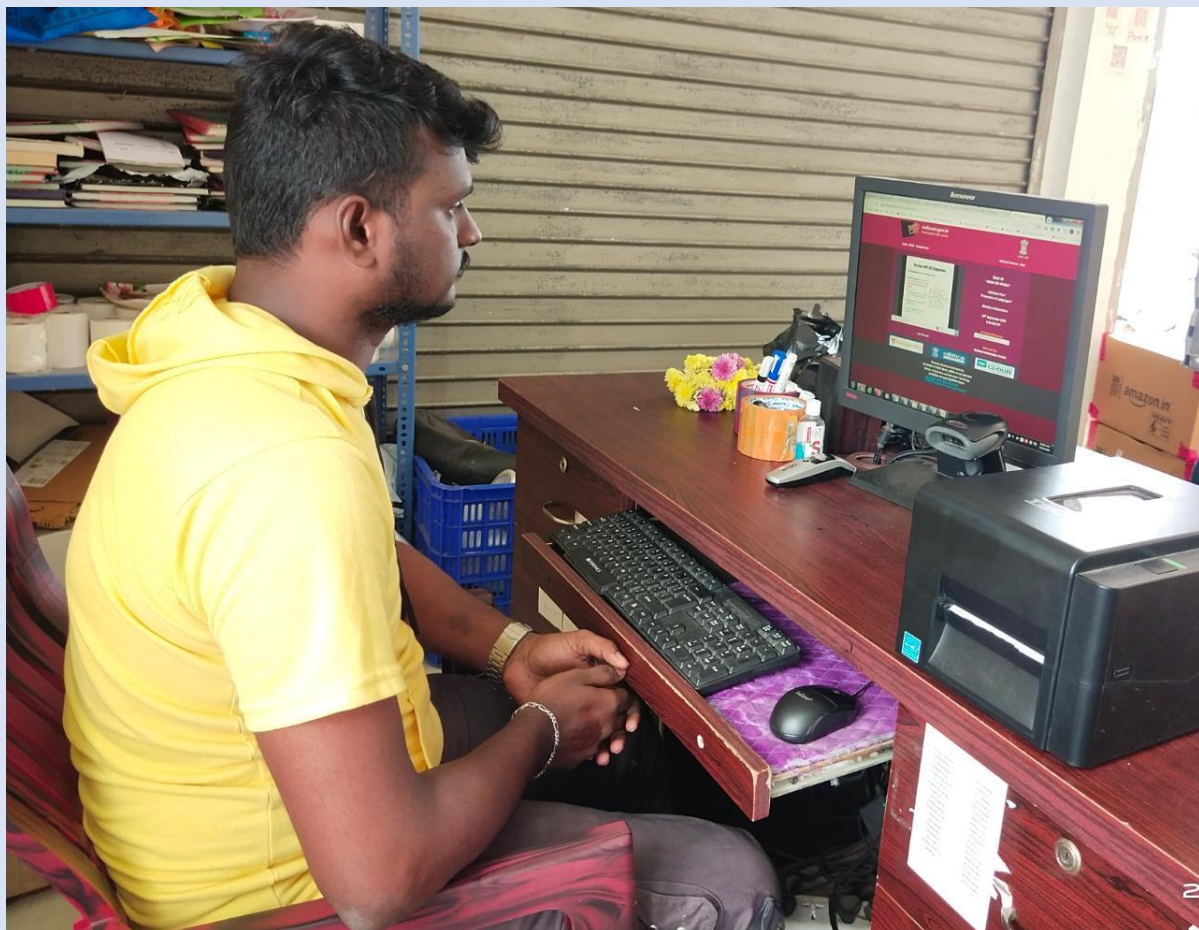

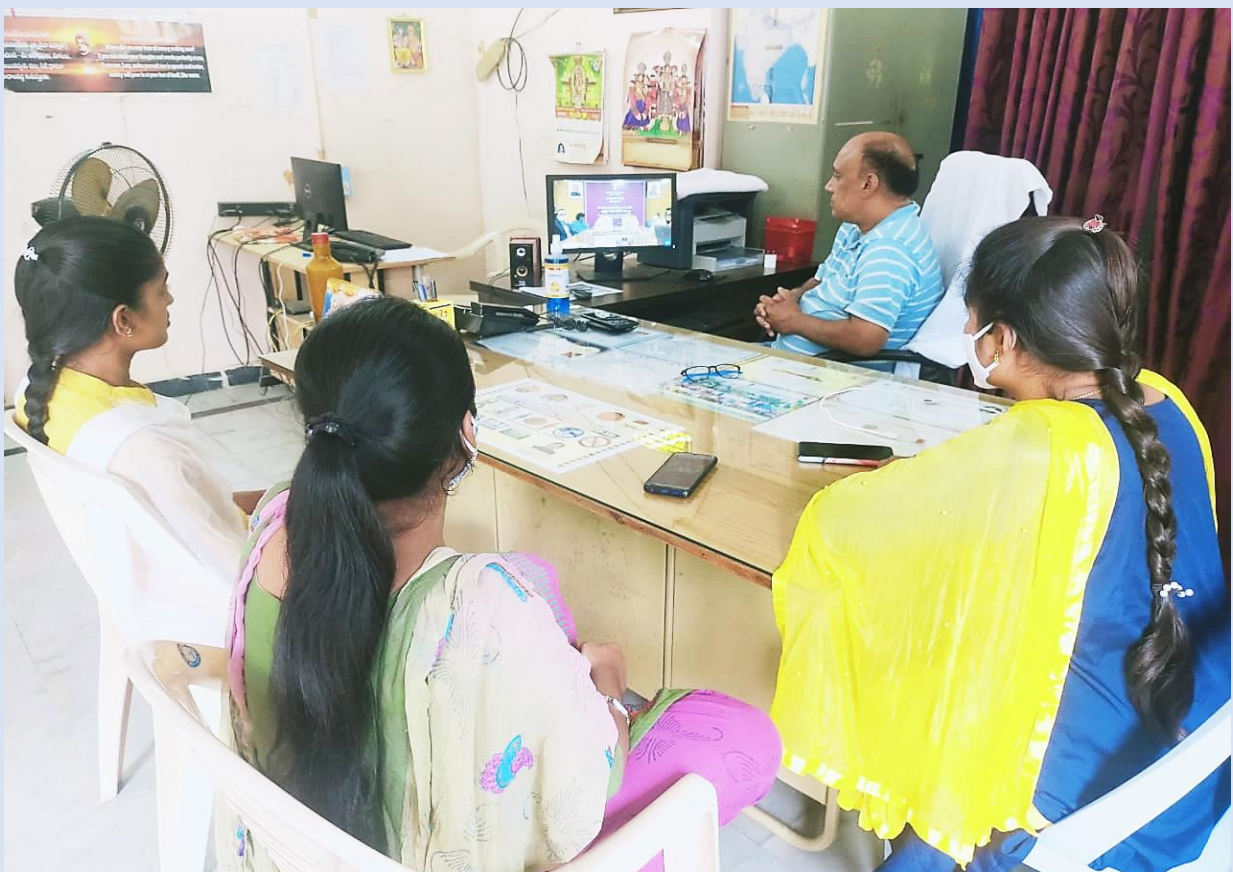
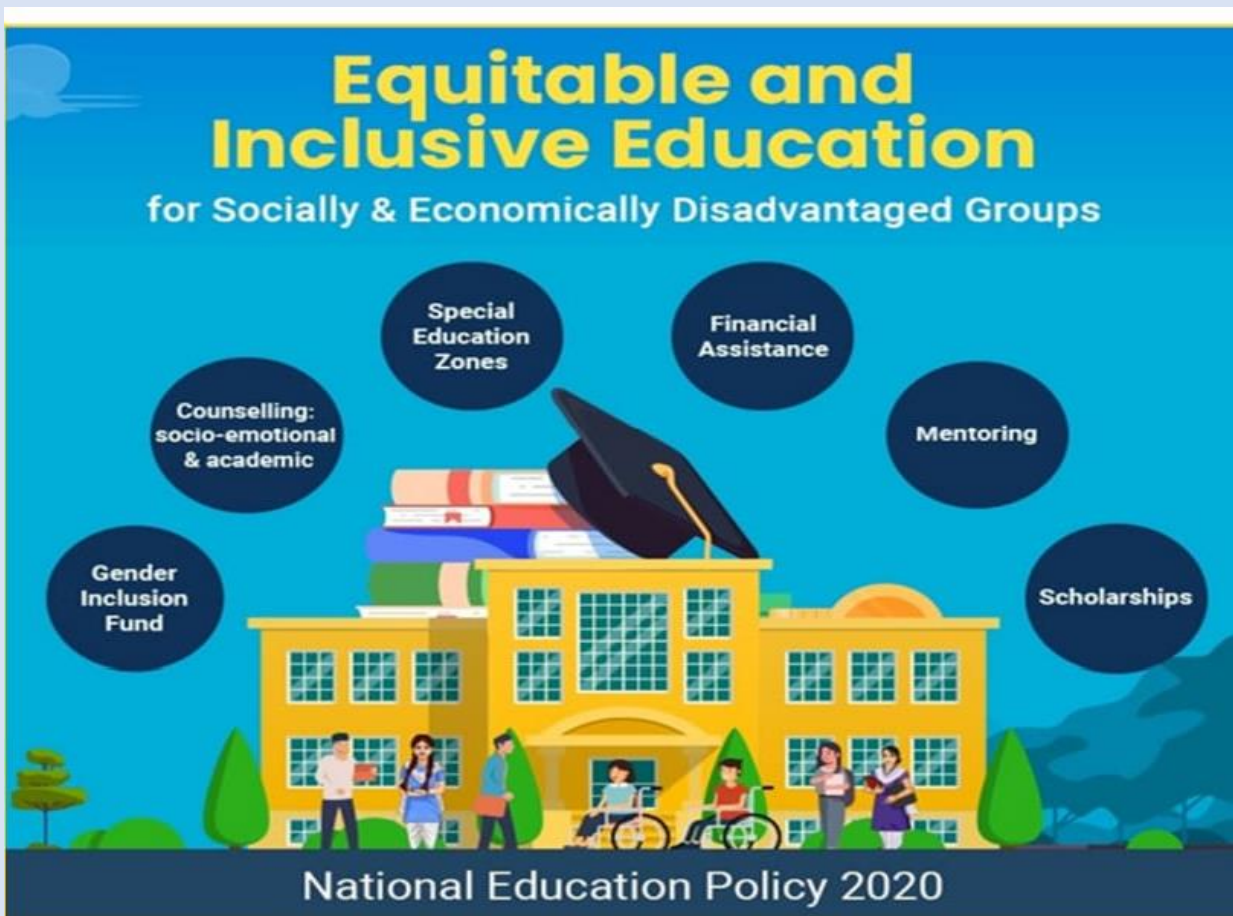

ADULT EDUCATION AND LIFELONG LEARNING (1/2)

- Use of schools/ school complexes beyond school hours and public library spaces for adult education courses which will be ICT-equipped when possible and for other community engagement and enrichment activities.
- Trained instructors/educators will be required to deliver the curriculum framework to mature learners
- Qualified community members including from Higher Educational Institutions to engage with their local communities will be encouraged and welcomed to take a short training course and volunteer.
- Quality technology-based options for adult learning such as apps, online courses/modules, satellite-based TV channels, online books, and ICT-equipped libraries and Adult Education Centres, etc. will be developed.
