INTRODUCTION

Tribes are a group of people having distinct language, culture, lifestyle and socio-economic condition and are living in a specific geographical area. Normally, the tribes reside in interior forests, remote and inaccessible areas or in the outskirts of forests and hilly regions. According to Article 180 of the Constitution, the Scheduled Tribes are the tribes or tribal communities or part of groups within these tribes and tribal communities, which have been declared as such by the President through a public notification. As per the 2011 Census, the Schedule Tribes account for 10.42 million representing 8.6 percent of the country's population. The tribes are characterized by distinct cultures, shyness of contact with other community's at large and economical backwardness.

Immediately after independence, Governments both at National and State level had given much attention for the development and welfare of the tribes and this has resulted in improving the living conditions of the tribes across the nation.

The tribes who are residing in the remote corners of the nation are not having first hand information about what is happening elsewhere in the country. If the student and youth communities are getting sufficient information and opportunities to interact with their peer groups in other parts of the nation, the extremist activities among them can be curtailed. In this context it is proposed that, the tribal youth should be positively engaged and educated and for that; tribal youth exchange programmes will be of great help.

The tribes who are residing in the remote corners of the nation are not having first hand information about what is happening elsewhere in the country. If the student and youth communities are getting sufficient information and opportunities to interact with their peer groups in other parts of the nation, the extremist activities among them can be curtailed. In this context it is proposed that, the tribal youth should be positively engaged and educated and for that; tribal youth exchange programmes will be of great help.



Aims & Objectives

- To provide an opportunity to the tribal youth of 28 selected districts of 07 states for exposure visit to 10 different places of the country to understand the cultural ethos, language, lifestyles of the people depicting Socio –economic & Cultural Development & Development process unity in diversity aspect of our national life.
- To expose tribal youth to the technological and industrial advancement that have taken place in different states of the country with focus on various developmental activities, skill development, educational & employment opportunities available there.
- To sensitize the tribal youth about their rich traditional & cultural heritage and enable them to preserve it for the future generation.
- To help the tribal youth to develop emotional linkages with their peer groups in other part of the country and enhance their self esteem.
- To provide opportunities to the participants for interactions with Hon'ble President of India, PM & CM, Governor & other VIPs, the local communities, Panchayati Raj Institutions and the youths affiliated with the NYKS Youth Clubs so as understand development issues, seek guidance for their involvement in the process of development.
- To develop personality of the tribal youth by enhancing their understanding
 of Ten Core Life Skills, identify their skill development oriented training
 needs and fulfillment of their legitimate career aspirations through
 Employable Skills, Scheme of Government of India and State Govt. and
 provide them necessary guidance and career counseling.
- To provide exposure to industry and Skill Development programme this can facilitate the provision of employment to the tribal youth.
- To provide literature on developmental schemes of the Centre & State pertaining to tribals.



Concept & Methodology

The tribes who are residing in the remote corners of the nation are not having first hand information about what is happening elsewhere in the country. If the student and youth communities are getting sufficient information and opportunities to interact with their peer groups in other parts of the nation, the extremist activities among them can be curtailed. In this context 9th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme was organised for positively engages and educate then.

Methodology

After several rounds of high level meetings and Video Conferencing held with the senior officers of MHA, CRPF, BSF, SSB, ITBP and NYKS it was decided to organize 9th Tribal Youth Exchange Programmes at ten venues. The venues were viz. Hyderabad (Andhra Pradesh), Jaipur (Rajasthan), Delhi, Bengaluru (Karnataka), Vadodara (Gujarat), Pune (Maharashtra), Chennai (Tamil Nadu), Jammu (J&K), Lucknow (Uttar Pradesh) and Shimla (Himachal Pradesh). The programme was organised by the concerned State Directors, NYKS with support of concerned DYCs of NYK. A total of 1995 Tribal Youths drawn from 28 focused districts which are included in the list of 106 districts covered under the SRE Scheme of Ministry of Home Affairs.

Sufficient number of the participants was selected by NYKS and CAPFs to factor in last minute drop out of the participants

- From the selected 28 districts (selected by Ministry of Home Affairs, GOI) on an average 10-40 tribal youths, (per district in 50:50 male: female ratio) in the age group of 18-22 years along with 02 official escorts (01 male & 01 female) were allotted at each programme location (venues) from the states of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand & Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra & Bihar (Annexure-1).
- The representatives of Panchayati Raj Institutions were also included within the total no. of participants and age relaxations were given to them, wherever necessary.

• During the 07 days Tribal Youth Exchange Programme, National Level Seminar, Panel Discussions, Lecture Series, Skill Development, Industry visit, Hospitality related visit, Hospital related skill training, Career Guidance (especially self employment on tribal artefacts by renowned NGOs/ govt. agencies), Orientation on Hospitality and Hospital management, Patriotism related programme, Cultural Programmes etc, were organized. Apart from that, the participants were also visited places of Historical and cultural importance of the host states. Interactive sessions with dignitaries and eminent personalities were value addition to this programme.



Broad Statistics about the issues

The tribal population of the country, as per 2011 census, is 10.43 crore, constituting 8.6% of the total population. 89.97% of them live in rural areas and 10.03% in urban areas. The decadal population growth of the tribal's from Census 2001 to 2011 has been 23.66% against the 17.69% of the entire population.

Tribals constitute a large percentage of population in Left Wing Extremism affected areas. As per data of Ministry of Home Affairs on state wise extent of LWE violence (during 2010-15), 2513 incidents took place during 2010 in which 1005 deaths were recorded. In 2011, 1760 incidents took place in which 611 deaths were recorded. In 2012, 1415 incidents took place in which 415 deaths were recorded. During 2013, 1136 incidents took place in which 397 deaths were recorded. In 2014, 1091 incidents took place in which 309 deaths were recorded. During the year 2015 (upto 15.04.15) 357 incidents took place with 79 deaths recorded.

From the above analysis, it is evident that LWE does present one of the gravest challenges to national security. The physical and demographic spread of the problem and the nature and degree of disillusionment reflects an unenviable reality, which requires sincere, unified and focused attention of every element of the government machinery to neutralise the hardline fringe Maoist element and simultaneously bring inclusive development to the areas.

There are 106 districts covered from 10 states viz. Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal under SRE (Security Related Expenditure) to LWE affected states by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India to address the issues.

28 districts covered under SRE Scheme were selected for 9th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme from the states of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Bihar, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana & Odisha for the year 2016-17.

The programme

The Tribal Youth Exchange Programme is organised every year in collaboration with and funding from the Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India. In this Programme, selected tribal youth from districts affected by Left-wing extremist in the States of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Bihar, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Odisha are taken to other parts of the country.

The programme aims to sensitize them to rich cultural heritage of the country and to enable them to appreciate the concept of unity in diversity, to expose them to development activities and technological/ industrial advancement in other parts of the country, to enable them to develop emotional linkage with the people in other parts of the country and to develop their personality by enhancing their understanding of the core life skills, identifying their skill development needs and providing them necessary career counseling.

Before commencement of the 9th Tribal Youth exchange Programme (One day Advance) a press meet was organised by NYKS, Andhra Pradesh & Telangana to brief the press about the 9th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme. After the arrival at the host city, the participants were accommodated in the place arranged for their lodging after their registration.

Thereafter session an defreezing & introduction was organised to make the participants familiar with the programmes, activities, purpose and expected outcome of the 9th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme. The participants were provided training kits which included following items:-

The pre evaluation sheets were provided to the participants and brief how to fill that. The escorts were involved for monitoring of the participants & facilitate in form fill up.

The programme was inaugurated in befitting manner in all the venues with the participation of VVIPs, Central Govt. officer, NYK Officer, State Govt. Officers, PRI Members & Local Youth.

The 9th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme 2016-17 has been organized at 10 venues covering 1995 tribal youth along with 206 Escorts from 28 LWE affected districts of the States of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Bihar, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Odisha. The venues of the programme were Gujarat, Jaipur, Lucknow, Pune, Hyderabad, Bengaluru, Jammu, Delhi and Shimla.

Vadodara, Gujarat (9th to 15th Dec 2016)

Rajasthan from 21st to 27th Dec 2016.









Excerpts from the speech of VVIPs & Dignitaries on 9th TYEP, 2016-17

- Dr. Jitendra Singh, Hon'ble Union MoS (I/C), DONER, PMO, Personnel Grievances, Atomic Energy and Space said that such youth exchange programme enable youth from various re3gious to interact, share knowledge and exchange ideas. He added that the participants should use this opportunity to represent their home state and share their own culture thus forgiving the way to become young ambassadors from peace. He further said that Govt. Of India has made significant investment for youth such as Start up India.
- Dr. A.K. - Maj. Gen. (Retd.) Dilawar Singh, Director General, NYKS stated that NYKSis committed to involve youth of the country in various developmental programmes for nation building and also briefed as the flagship scheme & programmes of Govt.
- Shri Rais Ahmad, Director (LWE-1) MHA, Govt. of India said that Tribal Youth Exchange programme organised with the cooperation of Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India. He also said that the tribal population of the country, as per 2011 census is 10.43 crore, constituting 8.6% of the total population. 89.97% of them live in rural areas and 10.03% in urban areas. - 12. None of Participants had travelled in Metro Train.

- 14. They all were determined to motivate others to refrain from naxalite activities and cooperate with para military forces in the process of eradication of extremist activities.
- 15. They were also determined to motivate their peers to download the Narendra Modi app for getting information on Flagship Programme of Government and participate in Nation Development Process.



- 16. Participants took much interest on their visit to CRPF Campus and get the information of job opportunities in CRPF.
- 17. For the first time the participants were happy to get opportunity to address the audience of 9th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme.

- 19. They were happy to get update information on development issues, tribal issues, flagship programme of Govt., Career Guidance, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship development etc.
- 20. The participants promised that after they reach their home they would propagate the message of developing, peace, brotherhood & develop NYKs Youth Clubs & for emphasing youth to participate in development process.
- 21. The participants expressed their happiness on entire programme & arrangement
- 22. Same of participants expressed their desire for organization of TYEP twice a year so that more tribal youth can get opportunity to participate.
- 23. Few participants were of the opinion to extend the duration of TYEP to 10 days.

- 25. The participants liked the segments of the programme which dealt with legal issues and guidance with regard to their career in agriculture & bio- diversity.

- 28. The participants quarrels vowed to make the youth aware on refraining from pity Naxalism, Drug abuse & Alcoholism and will connect with national mainstream & unity & brotherhood.
- 29. The participants appreciated the multi culturalise and unity in diversity.


